Chrysler Museum, the Orphan Car Show is specifically for vehicle makes (not models) of domestic car, truck or motorcycle that have not been produced for at least seven model years. For foreign vehicles (that's most of us), the vehicle makes must not have been imported for at least 7 model years.

This will be my third year going. It is truly amazing to see the makes that show up for the show. Yes, there are the usual ones like the Checkers, LaSalles, and Packards. But I've also seen Huppmobiles, Fire trucks and some I wouldn't venture a guess on. It is a very wide range of vehicles from all over the world. While most are in good condition, some are real museum pieces and a sight to see!

Yes, I'll be going to the show again this year in my 1973 MGB and would welcome any and all DTSC'ers to join me. It is a much shorter trip than the run to Perrysburg and a chance to see some very unique vehicles.

There is also a Saturday Cruise that starts at the Ypsilanti Heritage Museum with a Continental Breakfast and spends the day visiting several points of interest for auto enthusiasts, including Ed Meurer's private collection in Farmington Hills. The cruise includes Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner for a fee, or you can just follow the predetermined route for free. I'm planning on the cruise, too.

\* Eligibility . . .

ALL REGISTERED VEHICLES MUST BE FACTORY STOCK, UNMODIFIED, AT LEAST FIFTEEN (15) MODEL YEARS OLD, AND IN REASONABLE CONDITION.

We encourage the participation of un-restored vehicles. To qualify, a vehicle must be of a make (not model - except for the Chevrolet Corvair) of domestic car, truck, or motorcycle that has not been produced for at least seven (7) model years (Oldsmobiles & Plymouths are not eligible). Foreign vehicles must not have been imported to the U.S.A. for at least seven (7) model years. 1956-1957 model year Continental Mark II's are accepted.

Kit cars and most replicas are not accepted.
