The **Cherry Bowl Drive-in** Theatre has been in continual operation every summer season since it was built in 1953. The focus of the Cherry Bowl has always been to provide "Fine Film, Food, Fun and Family Entertainment."

The name Cherry Bowl was a natural for the theatre, as it was nestled in among the cherry orchards, of which this region of Michigan has gained worldwide acclaim, the Cherry Capital of the World. Located 18 miles southwest of Traverse City on US31, 7 miles from the Lake Michigan shore line and Sleeping Bear Park. The screen tower was widened in the late 1950's to accept the "New" phenomenon, "Cinemascope," a larger aspect ratio than was previously available. When we show some "Vintage" cartoons, if you look carefully, you will see the size of movies before cinemascope. Our sound system consists of the original vacuum tube motiograph amplifiers, that still power our speakers at the speaker posts. (These posts also light up with a warm red glow for a truly exceptional visual experience during the presentation.) We have also added the option of FM Radio sound. This permits you to hear the entire sound track of the preshow, feature, and vintage footage through your own in car stereo system.

Our picture throw is 100 yards from our projection booth to Northern Michigan's largest movie screen. Although we still own the carbon arc antique original projectors, we use modern projectors, with Xenon gas filled bulbs as light sources, and a state of the art platter system for film handing in order to provide our guest with the best possible evenings movie going experience. From our introduction film, through the 1st feature, intermission, and second feature, the screen is continually filled for your nostalgic drive in theatre experience. Some enjoy our vintage film, introduction, and intermission (and cartoons, too) more than they do the 2 top ten current releases that we play! Our drive in is always a double feature.

Our family has added some great new attractions: A 19 hole, 50's style Mini Golf Putt Putt course, complete with moving obstacles - a windmill, rotating dice, a castle with a draw bridge, and bowling pins just to name a few. Great family fun for everyone! Batter Up/ Home Run Derby Batting Cages are heads up great fun too! Softball, hardball and even major league hardball. Knock one out of



the park! Hula Hoop, Frisbee, and volleyball are all here too. And bouncers, play house, sand box, and the traditional favorite - a concrete tube.

The Cherry Bowl Diner is filled with great tasting homemade, handmade supper and snacks. Genuine Broaster Brand chicken, by the piece, dinner, bucket or meal is so great that we even offer it to go. Homemade, hand tossed pizza by the slice or the whole pie. Watch our 1953 Popcorn Popper make fresh corn before your eyes. For a taste tempting delight check out our menu.

Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore. Sweeping for 64 miles in a golden arc along Lake Michigan and is enjoyed by more than a million visitors a year. Located 23 miles west of Traverse City, covering 70,000 acres. Includes massive sand dunes, seven watersheds, four streams, 20 lakes, beech and maple forests, two islands and remains of 50 shipwrecks. The Dunes is a living museum our planet.

The Schooner Madeline and Sloop Welcome, The 92-foot "Madeline" is a replica of a wooden schooner that served as Traverse City's first schoolhouse. During sailing season is found at Clinch Park Marina, and available for evening sailing excursions and tours. "Welcome," a 55-foot replica of an British armed sloop, and built for the 1976 Bicentennial. 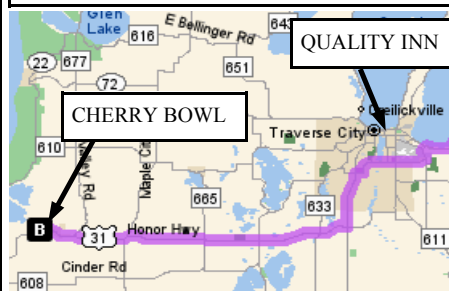
